



We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. ¹Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ²For he says, "In

a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you." → blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."


- P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.




